



## I buy bottled water by the case. Will I save money if I make my own French Water Cure Diet™ Water?

*You'll save a ton of money.*

Let's figure the cost of Aquafina as an example. Cost: Case of 24 20 oz bottles = \$18.

18 divided by 24 = 75 cents per bottle. 75 cents divided by 20 oz = you are paying 3.75 cents per oz. for Aquafina.

Now let's figure the cost per oz. of the French Water Cure Diet.

Based on calculation of:

One 2 liter bottle = 67.65 oz., minus 20% (80% filled for vortexing) = approx. 54 oz. per bottle.

One transformer makes just over 16,000 ounces, meaning you will be able to make about 300 54oz bottles (2 liter bottle, 80% filled) of French Water Cure Diet before replacing the transformer. Depending on your use, this same figure of 300 bottles holds approximately true for the electrolytes as well before they are depleted.

Therefore, we can very reasonably say that the original purchase of the French Water Cure Diet for \$99.95 is good for 300 54 oz bottles of French Water Cure Diet water (before replacing the transformer and electrolytes).

$300 \times 54 = 16,200$  total oz.  $\$99.95$  divided by 16,200 is \$.006, or just slightly more than 1/2 penny per oz of French Water Cure Diet water.

So let's summarize.

Aquafina is \$0.0375 cents per oz., and other than being plain water has no healing properties, is destructive to the environment, and you have to haul it from the store. It costs 6.25 times more than the French Water Cure Diet.

The French Water Cure Diet is \$.006 cents per oz, has healing properties in it, is not destructive to the environment and you don't have to haul it from the store. It costs 6.25 times less than Aquafina and other popular storebrand bottled waters.

Let's say you drink just 40 oz, or two bottles of bottled water per day. That's \$1.50 per day - not much, until you extrapolate the yearly cost at \$547.50.

Now let's say you drink 54 oz of Diet water you make at home. At \$.006 cents per ounce, that equals 32.4 cents per day, or \$118.26.

With our Diet, you get more water and save **\$429.24**. That answers your question, plus consider that not only do you save this money but you get the health benefits that you won't get from drinking just purified water, you'll save the environment from those empty bottles and you no longer have to transport that heavy water from the store.
